

#### **Beware the BEAR!**

A bear was sighted chillin' out in a neighbor's backyard in Emerald Trace overnight Friday, April 28th. That's only about ½ mile from Cypress Isles...ummm...that's getting a little close for my comfort level! He appeared to be a younger male looking for food. (But what bear isn't looking for food?) Beware and Be Aware! Contact the FWC's Wildlife Alert Hotline at 888-404-FWCC (3922) if you feel threatened by a bear, observe a sick, injured, dead or orphaned bear, or to report someone who is either harming bears or intentionally feeding them. Here are Six At Home BearWise Basics, ripped from the pages of WLCA's May 1st e-blast:

#### Never feed or approach bears.

Intentionally feeding bears or allowing them to find anything that smells or tastes like food teaches bears to approach home and people looking for more. Bears will defend themselves if a person gets too close, so don't risk your safety and theirs.

## Secure food, garbage, and recycling.

Food and food odors attract bears, so don't reward them with easily available food, liquids, or garbage.

#### Remove bird feeders when bears are active.

Birdseed and grains have lots of calories, so they're very attractive to bears. Removing feeders is the best way to avoid creating conflicts with bears.

### Never leave pet food outdoors.

Feed pets indoors when possible. If you feed pets outside, feed in single portions and remove food and bowls after feeding. Store pet food where bears can't see or smell it.

#### Clean and store grills.

Clean grills after each use and make sure that all grease, fat, and food particles are removed. Store clean grills and smokers in a secure area that keeps bears out.

#### Alert neighbors to bear activity.

See bears in the area or evidence of bear activity? Tell your neighbors and share information on how to avoid bear conflicts. Bears have adapted to living near people; now it's up to us to adapt to living near bears.

## **Water Restrictions**

No, they haven't gone away...



We are still under the same Orange County mandatory water restrictions that were implemented in 2008. As a reminder of what that means:

- Water only if necessary and not between 10:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m.
- Water in accordance with the following irrigation schedule:

Time of year	Homes with odd-numbered addresses	Homes with even-numbered addresses
Daylight Saving Time March 12, 2023 to November 4, 2023	Wednesday & Saturday	Thursday & Sunday
Standard Time November 5, 2023 to March 9, 2024	Saturday only	Sunday only

#### **BOTTOM LINE:**

NO WATERING on Monday, Tuesday, and Friday.

NO WATERING between 10:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. on your designated day, or ANY day.

The exceptions to these rules are newly planted sod (30 days); and "watering in" fertilizer or chemicals within 24 hours of application, but still not between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m.
