No Assessment Increase for Cypress Isles in 2022



But WLCA assessments will go up 15%.

On September 21st the Cypress Isles Board of Directors approved a \$29,960 operating budget for 2022 with homeowner assessments of \$53.50 per quarter, which is the same assessment as in 2020 and 2021. 'Nuf said. The operating budget is shown on some other page and posted on the Cypress Isles website.

In a related story, the WLCA Board of Directors approved a \$2.93 million operating budget with homeowner assessments of \$235.75 per quarter in 2022. The multi-page WLCA budget is posted on the WLCA website, available to all residents at http://www.mywaterfordlakes.org [resident login] Resources > Waterford Lakes Documents > Financial Documents > Waterford Lakes Budget.

The 2022 WLCA assessment represents a 15% increase over 2021 -- the largest increase allowed by the WLCA Declaration – and is almost entirely due to increased personnel and insurance expenses. Three new people will staff a newly established Community Standards Department to monitor property modifications and enforce WLCA ARC standards throughout Waterford Lakes, replacing the often-spotty inspections in many neighborhoods. Regarding insurance, WLCA's liability insurance premiums jumped by 83% this year because of residents' slip-and-fall claims that are filed against WLCA because of its perceived "deep pockets." (Those are all of OUR pockets, folks.)

Water Restrictions

No, they haven't gone away...

This article is a rerun for the benefit of new neighbors who may not know this info, and for some of us old-timers who may forget! ©



We are still under the same Orange County mandatory water restrictions that were implemented in 2008. As a reminder of what that means:

- Water only if necessary and not between 10:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m.
- Water in accordance with the following irrigation schedule:

Time of year	Homes with odd-numbered addresses	Homes with even-numbered addresses
Standard Time November 7, 2021 to March 12, 2022	Saturday only	Sunday only
Daylight Saving Time March 13, 2022 to November 6, 2022	Wednesday & Saturday	Thursday & Sunday

BOTTOM LINE:

NO WATERING on Monday, Tuesday, and Friday.

NO WATERING between 10:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. on your designated day, or ANY day.

Odd numbered houses (house number ends in 1, 3, 5, 7, 9) may water on Saturday all year, and also on Wednesday during Daylight Saving Time (March 10 – November 2, 2019)

Even numbered houses (house number ends in 0, 2, 4, 6, 8) may water on Sunday all year, and also on Thursday during Daylight Saving Time (March 10– November 2, 2019).

The exceptions to these rules are newly planted sod (30 days); and "watering in" fertilizer or chemicals within 24 hours of application, but still not between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m.

Orange County: 311 non-emergency help & info

We first ran this article in 2013. Now here is an updated version:

When you don't know where to go, Orange County 311 provides accurate and up to date information. They offer a wide variety of ways to contact them from phone calls, web chats, online requests and even through a smartphone app. Below we have listed all the service calls that they can help with:

ANIMALS

Citizens should contact 311 for a wide variety of animal issues including stray, abandoned or lost and found pets; animal cruelty and neglect; nuisance behavior and aggressive dogs; and trapped, injured, sick, or dead animals.

ROAD AND DRAINAGE

Call 311 for Roads and Drainage concerns associated with Unincorporated Orange County. The Roads and Drainage Division routinely receives service requests for highway maintenance, mowing, potholes, sidewalk repairs and tree trimming on the County rights-of-way.

ZONING

The Zoning Division performs meticulous and specialized tasks, but 311 is still able to assist with information about garage sale permits, office hours, directions and referral for various other services.

CODE ENFORCEMENT

Most of the contacts for Code Enforcement include a lot of clean up, junk vehicles, un-permitted construction, signs in the right-of-way and various zoning violations in Unincorporated Orange County.

TRAFFIC ENGINEERING

Contact 311 for Traffic Engineering services provided in Unincorporated Orange County. We will coordinate a service request for signal malfunctions, signs damaged or down, traffic calming devices and traffic studies.

MOSQUITO CONTROL

Orange County is working to combat elevated mosquito populations. Contact 311 to request Mosquito Control services in your community. Mosquito Control will assist in minimizing the nuisance of mosquitoes and ensuring public and community safely.

PEOPLE WITH SPECIAL NEEDS

Citizens may contact 311 to register for the People with Special Needs Program. During times of disasters, the People with Special Needs Program provides an array of services to qualifying residents. Services include notifications of natural disasters and transportation assistance to a shelter that provides accommodations for certain health and medical conditions.

DISASTER SITUATIONS

311 is the point of contact for disaster situations within Unincorporated Orange County.

- Roads blocked or closed
- Traffic lights and street signs
- Trees and debris in roads
- Flooding
- Request for sandbags
- Flooded roads
- Rising waters

- Severe weather and hurricanes
- Shelter locations and availability
- Pet-friendly shelter designations
- Building damage
- Special and elderly-needs services
- Water and ice distribution points
- Consumer fraud and price gouging

www.cfcrimelinewarrants.com - to check individuals for warrants.
